2018 Healthy Ulster Council Annual Report

The Healthy Ulster Council (HUC) is a coalition of community agencies and organizations that meet bimonthly to foster communications, awareness, and potential synergies in and among organizations and individuals working on various aspects of community wellness and prevention. The mission of HUC is to strengthen collaboration between organizations working to promote wellness, prevent illness and improve health outcomes through collective action and projects.

The 2018 Annual Report summarizes the outcomes of Council meetings, networking opportunities, collective action, and communications. It also includes an update on the status of the Inventory for Health. The report is organized into 4 sections: Healthy Ulster Council Meetings, Networking, Communications and the Inventory for Health. In addition, a list of the 2018 participating agencies and organizations as well as meeting photos have been included. There are 3 Appendices to the report, which include 2018 HUC Meeting Attendance, 2018 HUC Constant Contact List Updates, and the 2018 Inventory for Health.

I. Healthy Ulster Council Meetings

In 2018, in a partnership with the Ulster County Department of Health, Cornell Cooperative Extension of Ulster County provided coordination and facilitation for 6 bi-monthly Healthy Ulster Council meetings. Eighty-three professionals from 40 organizations attended these meetings for the purposes of professional development, networking and collective action (see Appendix A). The number of attendees in 2018 increased by 42% and the number of organizations represented increased by 45% compared to the 48 professionals from 22 organizations that attended these meetings in 2017. The 2018 average meeting attendance was 25 persons per meeting.

Professional development at HUC meetings included two formal presentations from the Ulster County Department of Health. The first, shared annually, focused on the "Prevention Agenda Update", which along with a discussion of the RWJF Ulster County Health rankings, set the tone for the work of the Healthy Ulster Council for the year. The second presentation focused on "Substance Use Prevention Strategy and www.UlsterHelps.org, addressed the increase in the rate of premature mortality in Ulster County, primarily as a result of opioid overdoses. Additional professional development, provided by guest presenters from 10 agencies and organizations that work within Ulster County, addressed the NYS Prevention Agenda priorities identified in the updated 2016-18 Ulster County Community Health Improvement Plan: Prevent Chronic Disease and Promote Mental Health/Prevent Substance Abuse. These professional development presentations are listed below in chronological order:

II. Networking

Promoting synergies among health and wellness agencies and organizations is one of the goals of HUC. Opportunities for networking were provided at each bi-monthly HUC meeting and were fostered through a thirty minute facilitated program sharing session. Program sharing was captured in the meeting notes for each Council meeting and posted on the www.healthyulstercounty.org website. Agencies and organizations were encouraged to share flyers, brochures, cards and program materials at each meeting, and to utilize the events page of www.healthyulstercounty.org website and the Healthy Ulster Council Google Group for a greater reach. HUC attendees were additionally offered the opportunity to sign up to present relevant programs at HUC meetings, and/or on the Healthy Ulster radio show.

Mobilizing the collective power of the coalition to advocate for healthy environments was actualized through a request to the Healthy Ulster Council to support Ulster County's T21 Legislation to raise the age for purchasing tobacco products in Ulster County to 21. Healthy Ulster Council members were urged to attend the meeting and speak on behalf of passing the T21 Bill. Several members of HUC, including the Coordinator, were present at the T21 Public Hearing in April 2018 and provided supporting testimony for passing the legislation, which ultimately passed. In an effort to enable the Healthy Ulster Council to more easily support policy that supports the mission and vision of the Council, a request for a written HUC Commitment of Membership (COM) was shared with attendees throughout the year. This endeavor was not successful, with only two HUC COM's returned. As the written commitment to the mission of HUC would allow for UCDOH and the Coordinator to provide written letters of support on behalf of HUC, for policies that positively impact health and wellness in a timely manner, the endeavor will be re-introduced in 2019.

Healthy Ulster Council meetings role modeled healthy meeting behavior and included both healthy snacks and a 5-10 minute physical activity break. Physical activity breaks included youtube videos, as well as exercises and movement games led by Melinda Herzog, the HUC Coordinator and CCE-Ulster County Healthy Communities Program Leader, and Stacy Kraft, the Public Health Education Coordinator for the Ulster County Department of Health. III. Healthy Ulster Council Communications

CCEUC sent all meeting announcements and communications for the Healthy Ulster Council through Constant Contact and the Healthy Ulster County Google Group. Information was also shared via the Bringing Agencies Together and the Ulster County Human Services listservs. There are currently 417 contacts listed on the Healthy Ulster Constant Contact listserv. The list is updated bi-monthly, with 42 new contacts added in 2018, and 5 removed (See Appendix B). New members are added upon attending a Healthy Ulster Council meeting and by request. Use of the healthyulstercounty.net website was promoted at Council meetings and on the bi-monthly meeting announcements with reminders to review meeting notes, presenters' power points, and data shared at Council meetings. Members were also encouraged to list their events on the event page of the site.

IV. Inventory for Health

The Ulster County Inventory for Health was updated extensively in 2018 (See Appendix C). Data obtained from the October 2017 survey, which yieded 67 responses, was compiled and applied to the Inventory for Health in early 2018. The Inventory was then reviewed by CCEUC and UCDOH in a series of meetings where information gaps were identified and completed using local knowledge. The Inventory for Health is a living document, and as such will need continued review and updates. The perameters of the instrument are directly aligned with the strategies in Robert Wood Johnson Foundation's (RWJF) "What Works for Health". http://www.countyhealthrankings.org/take-action-to-improve-health/what-works-for-health . These strategies are a menu of tools, policies and programs that can be used locally to improve health outcomes. CCEUC is currently developing a new tool utilizing the language in RWJF's "What Works for Health" to help agencies and organizations to self-identify which RWJF strategies that they are currently implementing, which will ultimately result in a more relevant Inventory for Health. The updated Inventory for Health will be posted on the www.healthyulstercounty.org website, and will serve to help agencies and organizations to identify what strategies to improve health and well being are currently being implemented in Ulster County, and who is working on them. Identifying both synergies and gaps is important in building a network of programs and policies to improve health.

Introduction

The Healthy Ulster Council Inventory for Health, a localized list of prevention activities, is a tool to identify policies and programs in place in Ulster County which have a positive impact on the health and welfare of people who live, work and play within the county. The Inventory can be used to identify strengths and weaknesses in addressing issues that affect health locally. It can also be utilized as a tool for learning which agencies and organizations are working on the identified strategies listed within the Inventory. This document is a living document, and as such is based on the current work as identified through surveys implemented at a given time. This inventory is based on surveys and data collected October-December of 2017, which has been expanded to include local common knowledge.

The framework for organizing the Inventory is based on *What Works for Health*, created by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation (RWJF) and the University of Wisconsin Population Health Institute on the County Health Rankings and Roadmaps website. *What Works for Health* provides communities with information to help select and implement evidence-informed policies, programs, and system changes that will improve the variety of factors we know affect health.

What Works for Health rates the evidence of effectiveness of various strategies used to improve health. More information detailing what each strategy listed includes, and how it is evaluated, can be found on the What Works for Health website:

http://www.countyhealthrankings.org/roadmaps/what-works-for-health. For the purposes of this document, we have listed a description of the Strategy Effectiveness Ratings below. A Key using the first letters of each Strategy Effectiveness Rating is also listed at the top of each page, so that readers can identify the rating of the strategy while viewing the table. An additional strategy rating has been included for strategies employed in Ulster County which are not rated on the What Works for Health website, and are simply titled "Ulster County Strategy". The What Works for Health website does not include a list of all of the possible strategies used to support good health. They are adding new strategies each month as they are evaluated.

- **Scientifically Supported**: Strategies with this rating are most likely to make a difference. These strategies have been tested in many robust studies with consistently positive results.
- **Some Evidence:** Strategies with this rating are likely to work, but further research is needed to confirm effects. These strategies have been tested more than once and results trend positive overall.
- **EXPERT Opinion:** Strategies with this rating are recommended by credible, impartial experts but have limited research documenting effects; further research, often with stronger designs, is needed to confirm effects.
- **IE Insufficient Evidence:** Strategies with this rating have limited research documenting effects. These strategies need further research, often with stronger designs, to confirm effects.
- **ME Mixed Evidence:** Strategies with this rating have been tested more than once and results are inconsistent or trend negative; further research is needed to confirm effects.
- **EVIDENCE OF Ineffectiveness**: Strategies with this rating are not good investments. These strategies have been tested in many robust studies with consistently negative and sometimes harmful results.
- **UCS Ulster County Strategy:** This denotes a strategy not listed on the *What Works for Health* policies and programs that can improve health tool, but it is an activity occurring in Ulster County. Not being listed on the *What Works for Health* website does not mean it is an ineffective strategy. It only means RWJF has not evaluated and listed it yet.



Introduction

The Healthy Ulster Council Inventory for Health, a localized list of prevention activities, is a tool to identify policies and programs in place in Ulster County which have a positive impact on the health and welfare of people who live, work and play within the county. The Inventory can be used to identify strengths and weaknesses in addressing issues that affect health locally. It can also be utilized as a tool for learning which agencies and organizations are working on the identified strategies listed within the Inventory. This document is a living document, and as such is based on the current work as identified through surveys implemented at a given time. This inventory is based on surveys and data collected October-December of 2017, which has been expanded to include local common knowledge.

The framework for organizing the Inventory is based on *What Works for Health*, created by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation (RWJF) and the University of Wisconsin Population Health Institute on the County Health Rankings and Roadmaps website. *What Works for Health* provides communities with information to help select and implement evidence-informed policies, programs, and system changes that will improve the variety of factors we know affect health.

What Works for Health rates the evidence of effectiveness of various strategies used to improve health. More information detailing what each strategy listed includes, and how it is evaluated, can be found on the What Works for Health website:

http://www.countyhealthrankings.org/roadmaps/what-works-for-health. For the purposes of this document, we have listed a description of the Strategy Effectiveness Ratings below. A Key using the first letters of each Strategy Effectiveness Rating is also listed at the top of each page, so that readers can identify the rating of the strategy while viewing the table. An additional strategy rating has been included for strategies employed in Ulster County which are not rated on the What Works for Health website, and are simply titled "Ulster County Strategy". The What Works for Health website does not include a list of all of the possible strategies used to support good health. They are adding new strategies each month as they are evaluated.

- **Some Evidence:** Strategies with this rating are likely to work, but further research is needed to confirm effects. These strategies have been tested more than once and results trend positive overall.
- **EXPERT Opinion:** Strategies with this rating are recommended by credible, impartial experts but have limited research documenting effects; further research, often with stronger designs, is needed to confirm effects.
- **IE Insufficient Evidence:** Strategies with this rating have limited research documenting effects. These strategies need further research, often with stronger designs, to confirm effects.
- **ME Mixed Evidence:** Strategies with this rating have been tested more than once and results are inconsistent or trend negative; further research is needed to confirm effects.
- **EVIDENCE OF Ineffectiveness**: Strategies with this rating are not good investments. These strategies have been tested in many robust studies with consistently negative and sometimes harmful results.
- **UCS Ulster County Strategy:** This denotes a strategy not listed on the *What Works for Health* policies and programs that can improve health tool, but it is an activity occurring in Ulster County. Not being listed on the *What Works for Health* website does not mean it is an ineffective strategy. It only means RWJF has not evaluated and listed it yet.


